



COMMERCIAL PROPERTY

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Companies need commercial property for their businesses to thrive. When real estate agents hold commercial property they treat it similarly to the residential kind. Often it is the case that signs will advertise the availability of the property and arrangements to buy or lease smaller lots can be made. Lawyers will usually be involved when commercial premises are bought, sold or when a lease is being granted, transferred or terminated.

Using solicitors to help purchase commercial property is important because they will often bargain with the seller to make improvements to the land and the buildings.

A professional developer may purchase huge swathes of commercial property simply to

Although it is rare that commercial property intrudes on residential areas as planners seek to avoid conflicts between businesses and homeowners there are sometimes city areas spaces designated for 'mixed usage'.
